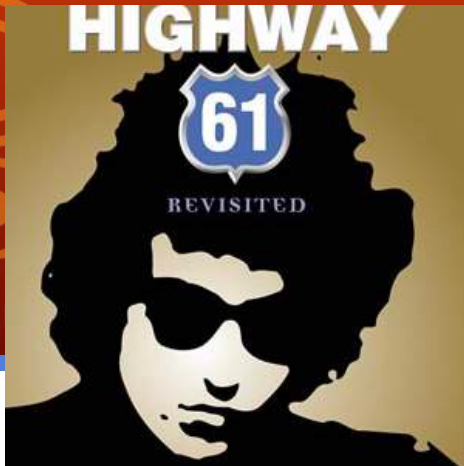

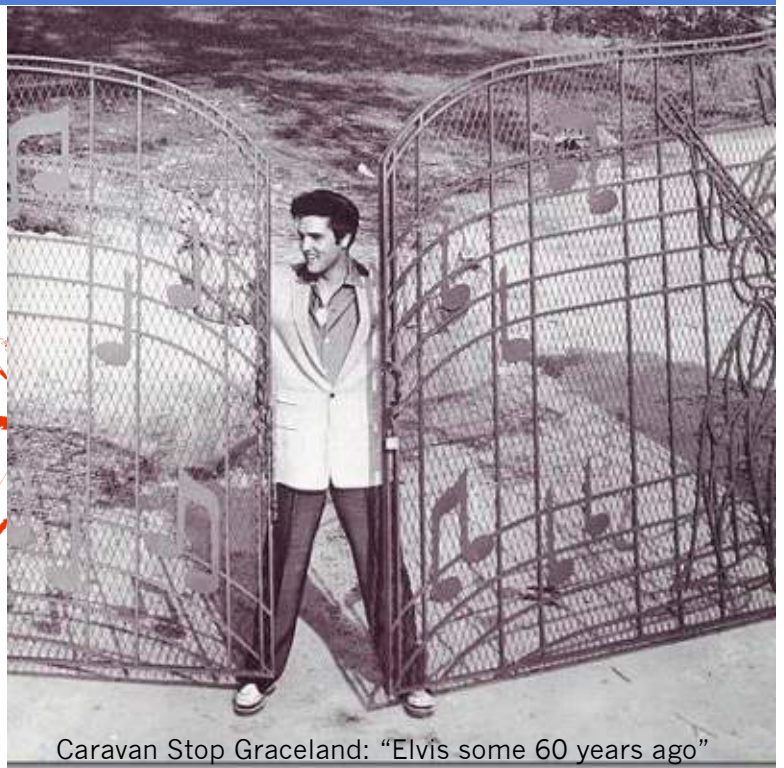

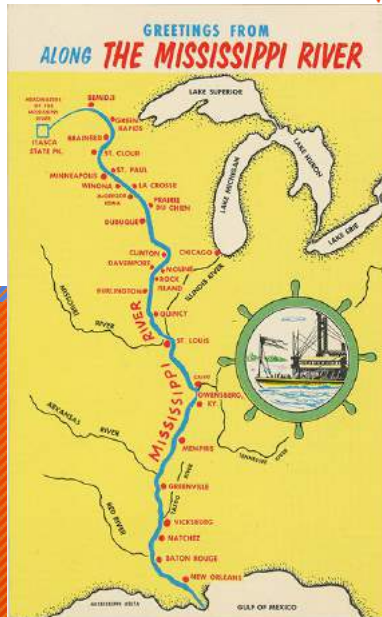

#61 TIDBITS

As laws change from state to state, here are the phone regulations on our Caravan Route: In MINNESOTA, WISCONSIN, IOWA, KENTUCKY, ARKANSAS, MISSISSIPPI and LOUISIANA: talking on cell phone while driving is allowed, texting while driving is prohibited. ILLINOIS bans talking on an hand-held cell phone and texting while driving. MISSOURI: talking on cell phone and texting is allowed. Reception is generally good along Highway 61. The Caravan Leader is with AT&T, this may vary with Verizon or others. In Duluth every participant will receive a complete list of cell phone numbers. This is important in case of a medical or mechanical emergency but also if you want to communicate with the Caravan Leader. WBCCI strongly recommends a CB, but it is not mandatory. Your Caravan Leader has a CB in the truck and designates Channel 14 for Hwy 61. Please be aware that a CB has a limited reach. Next step up are FRS/GMRS two-way radios with an "optimistic" 18-mile range, and they also come in handy for parking your Airstream. This Caravan is fortunate to have already 5 FCC-licensed Ham Radio operators onboard: Franklin - WF4DS, Stu - WA6BTK, John - K9XT, Mary Ellen - K9MED, and Caravan Leader Ingo - KK6EWB. This gives us an added layer of security. When everything else fails, Ham or Amateur Radio will still be there. We will be in good hands on 61. Talking about good hands. Also known as the caboose, we promoted Angus already to Rear Admiral. This means nobody will be left behind. Guided by his charming wife Kelli, if he comes upon an Airstreamer who has a breakdown they will offer support until the problem is resolved. They are not expected to perform repair service, this should be left to the pros such as AAA, Good Sam, etc. Tom, a retired professor of accounting, volunteered already to audit our financial books and Caravan trust account. We're in good hands
